Counties Manukau Scholarships -South Auckland Health Foundation Scholarships The health scholarship programme is a partnership between the South Auckland Health Foundation and Counties Manukau DHB to support local students wanting to study health. The scholarships are for one year and are up to \$5000 for tuition fees only. A number of scholarships are awarded each year and the key criteria for these scholarships relate to academic achievement, community involvement and financial hardship. Maori and Pacific students are strongly encouraged to apply as we would like our workforce to better reflect the community we serve. Applications close around October each year. Dr John McLeod Scholarship It is a prestigious award to recognise excellence. Recipients are considered to possess a strong commitment towards Māori health gain, leadership qualities and excellence in academia. There are no applications. Dr John McLeod Scholars are chosen by a panel made up of representatives from Te Puni Kokiri, National Council of Māori Nurses, Te Ohu Rata (Māori Medical Practitioners Association of Aotearoa), Māori medical students and the Ministry of Health.

Hauora Maaori Scholarships

The scholarships are sponsored by the Ministry of Health to assist students to undertake or complete an NZQA accredited course in health and disability services, in order to build Maaori workforce capacity in the sector.

Hiwinui Heke Scholarships.

The Maori Pharmacists' Association (MPA) has announced the establishment of the Hiwinui Heke Scholarships. Two of which will be for \$2500 and will be awarded to a University of Otago School of Pharmacy student, an Auckland University School of Pharmacy student and a \$5000 scholarship will go to a pharmacy technician wishing to advance their career in pharmacy. Applications will close in July and a decision will be made by the end of August.

Jack Noel Henderson Scholarship

The Jack Noel Henderson Scholarship provides for two scholarships of \$3,000 each.

Applicants must be in their second year of full time study at either Otago or Auckland Schools of Pharmacy and will be required to prove New Zealand citizenship. If an award is made, the scholarship will be paid to the recipient/s in the second semester (approx mid July) to pay actual costs, e.g. enrolment fees, text books.

Regional Health Authorities Scholarship

Regional Health Authorities (HFA) Maori Health Scholarships

The Te Apa Mareikura scholarships are awarded to people who are competent in community health, have strong connections with the community, proven leadership ability, effective community networks and academic performance contributing to future Maori health gains. In 2008 two scholarships of \$10,000 each were awarded.

University of Otago Māori & Pacific Islands Entrance Scholarships

Established by the University of Otago Council in 2005 to celebrate academic excellence and cultural diversity, these scholarships are intended to encourage the progression of Māori and Pacific Islands students into tertiary study. Up to 30 scholarships will be awarded annually, of which 20 to 25 will normally be to Māori students, and the remainder to Pacific Island students. The current value of the scholarship is \$10,000.

Waikato Primary Health Rural Scholarships

Rural health scholarships are available for pharmacy and other health professional students keen to work in the Waikato region.

People considering applying for a Waikato Primary Health Rural Scholarship are being encouraged to send in applications by April 17 to avoid missing up to \$10,000 toward study costs.

Scholarship criteria

There are four types of applicant criteria for people to consider when applying for a scholarship.

They must be either a student currently enrolled in a health-related programme of study such as undergraduate study or a health professional completing or intending on completing post-graduate study. Alternatively they might be newly qualified health professionals carrying heavy student debt, or are health professionals upskilling to return to the workforce.

People studying in these areas are of particular interest: ambulance services, dental therapy, dietetics, nursing, midwifery, pharmacy, physiotherapy, podiatry, medicine and mental health. However, other disciplines may be considered.

The scholarships have been running for five years. Each scholarship for undergraduate students is worth up to \$10,000 and an additional \$5000 is available to postgraduate students.
